

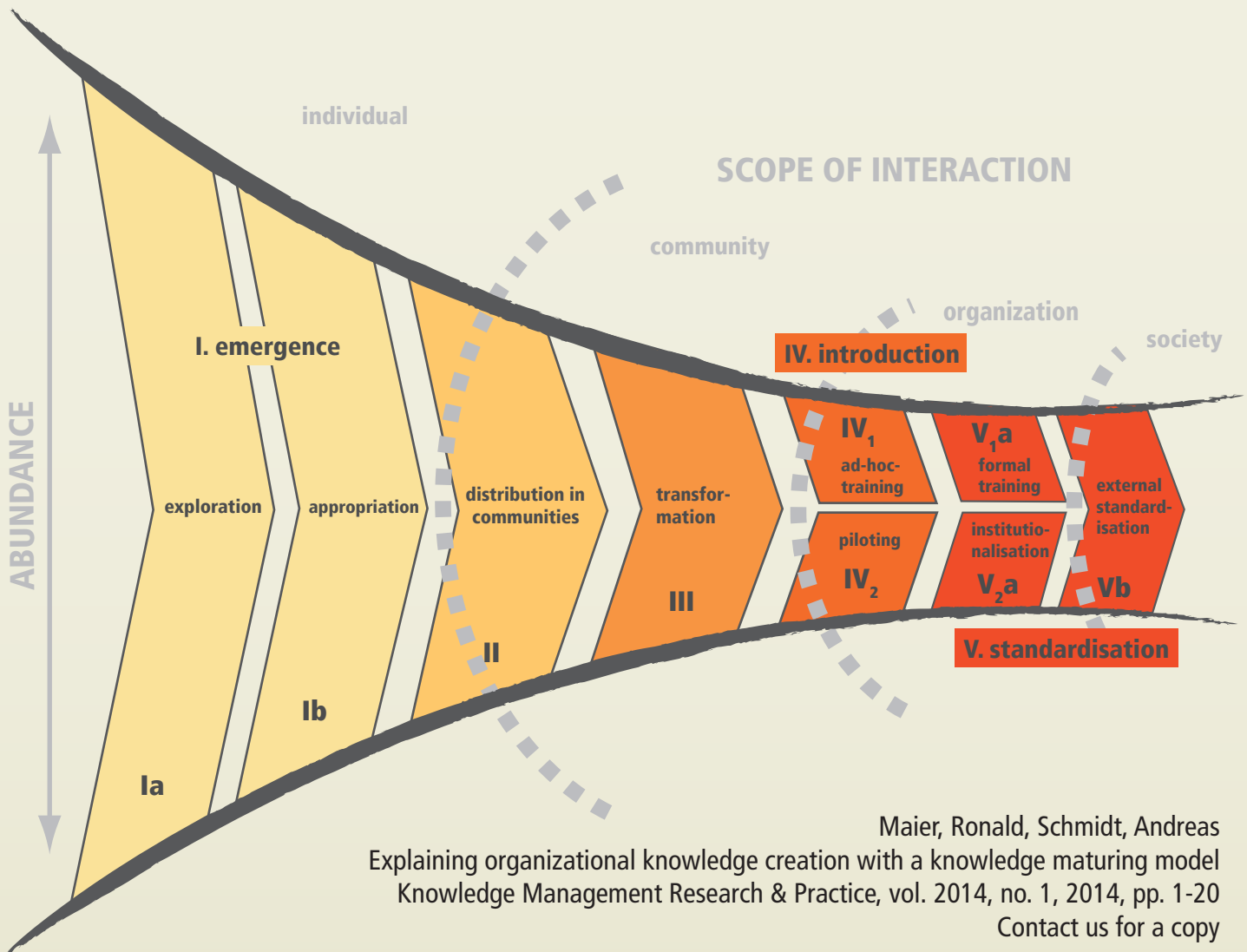

With the advent of social media, knowledge management had to rethink its conceptual foundations on how knowledge develops on a collective level. Ten years ago, at I-KNOW 2005, the very first version of the model was presented, and since then, numerous cross-disciplinary research activities have contributed to the extension and refinement of the model.
